Additionally, the Mekong River Bridge in Phnom Penh, part of Xi Jinping Boulevard, is under construction to improve connectivity with Kandal province, reflecting Cambodia's focus on modern, large-scale bridge projects. Cable-Stayed Bridges: Modern urban bridges in Phnom Penh, designed for heavy traffic and durability.
