

Can a third-level distribution box be connected to another third-level distribution box

A third-level (tertiary) distribution box should not be connected after another third-level distribution box; each tertiary box must directly supply its own electrical equipment according to the hierarchical distribution principle.

Hierarchical Structure of Three-Level Distribution

In a standard three-level distribution system:

- Primary distribution box:** Receives power from the transformer and distributes it to secondary distribution boxes. It does not directly supply end-use equipment.
- Secondary distribution box:** Acts as an intermediate hub, distributing three-phase power to tertiary boxes or heavy loads. It also does not directly supply individual equipment.
- Tertiary distribution box:** The final distribution point, supplying single-phase power (220V) directly to electrical equipment. Each tertiary box is designed to control and protect a specific device or set of devices, following the principle of “one device, one circuit breaker, one residual current device, one box”.

Why Cascading Tertiary Boxes is Not Allowed

According to electrical distribution standards:

- No bypassing of levels:** Tertiary boxes must connect directly to the equipment they control. Connecting one tertiary box after another would bypass the intended hierarchical structure, compromising safety and protection.
- Protection and isolation:** Each tertiary box includes its own circuit breaker and residual current device (RCD) to protect the connected equipment. Cascading tertiary boxes could result in multiple devices being controlled by a single upstream breaker, violating the “one machine, one switch” principle.
- Voltage and load considerations:** Tertiary boxes are designed for specific voltage and load limits. Connecting them in series could lead to voltage drops, overloads, and potential safety hazards.
