Overview

On June 4, 2025, Chile's government and Google formalized an agreement to build the Humboldt Cable, a submarine fiber-optic line that will directly connect South America and the Asia-Pacific region. Chile has taken a huge and historic step forward at the digital level, thanks to the implementation of the Humboldt underwater cable. Along the Pacific coast of Chile, the ocean stretches outward with a kind of endless. The Chilean Competition Authority (FNE) has cleared in Phase 2, subject to structural remedies, the acquisition by OnNet of Entel's fiber to the home network infrastructure assets (FTTH). Stretching about 15,000 kilometers, it will connect Valparaíso, Chile, to Sydney, Australia, and then extend to Asia.
