

Cold aisle length requirements for micro-modules

The modular design allows flexible expansion along the length direction, meaning the aisle can be extended by adding additional modules while maintaining proper airflow and containment.

Containment and Airflow Management

Cold aisle containment in micro-modules ensures that cold air is directed precisely into server intakes, preventing mixing with hot exhaust air and improving cooling efficiency. Modular micro-units often feature sealed channels, tempered glass panels, and integrated cable management, which help maintain consistent temperatures and prevent short-circuiting of cold air. This design supports safe operation even in high-density deployments.

Practical Recommendations

Follow standard aisle length limits: 16 meters for open-ended aisles, 6 meters for restricted aisles. Use modular expansion: Extend cold aisles by adding prefabricated micro-modules to maintain ai...
