Without protective measures, such as concrete or plastic barriers, the risk of damage and accidents rises significantly.
- 5. Inadequate Lightning and Surge Protection** Many distribution boxes are damaged by lightning strikes due to insufficient surge protection. Installing surge arresters only on incoming lines leaves outgoing lines vulnerable, which can result in total system failure.
