Cable Handling and Placement Fiber optic cables are fragile and sensitive to bending. Avoid sharp bends or kinks, as excessive bending can cause signal attenuation or microfractures in the fiber. When routing the cable below the router: Keep the fiber cable loosely coiled if extra length is needed. Maintain the minimum bend radius recommended by the manufacturer. Avoid placing the cable under heavy objects or in high-traffic areas to prevent damage. Use cable clips or conduits to secure the fiber neatly without stressing the cable.

Indoor vs. Outdoor Considerations If the fiber enters from outside, it may pass through a Network Interface Device (NID) or wall outlet before reaching the ONT. Indoor fiber should be rated for indoor use to maintain electrical isolation and prevent interference. Outdoor fiber with metal sheaths should not be used indoors, as it can compromise electrical isolation.

Optimizing Router Placement Place your router in a central location relative to your devices to maximize Wi-Fi coverage. Ensure the Ethernet cable from the ONT to the router is as short as practical to reduce potential signal loss. For multi-gigabit setups, consider routers with SFP+ ports or high-speed WAN ports to fully leverage fiber speeds.
