- Evidence and expert testimony:** Technical evidence such as network diagrams, OTDR testing, and expert witness analysis is essential to establish causation and liability.
- Damages assessment:** Claims may include repair costs, lost revenue, or consequential losses. Accurate calculation requires understanding network protocols and capacity, as some lost capacity may not translate to lost revenue.
