Load and Fill Limits: NEC 392 specifies that power cables must not exceed 40% of the tray's cross-sectional area, and control cables 50%. Adding flat iron reduces usable space, so cable fill calculations must account for the flat iron's cross-section.

Clearances: Maintain at least 12 inches of vertical clearance above the tray for installation and maintenance access. Flat iron should not obstruct cable placement or violate this clearance.

Grounding: If the flat iron is metallic and in contact with a metallic tray, it can contribute to grounding continuity, but it must meet NEC bonding requirements.

Attachment Methods: Flat iron can be secured using bolts, clamps, or welding, depending on tray material and environmental conditions. Ensure that attachment does not compromise tray integrity or violate m...
