- Polish type:** UPC (Ultra Physical Contact) or APC (Angled Physical Contact) depending on network requirements.

Connecting Pigtails to Fiber Cables The connection process involves splicing the bare end of the pigtail to the fiber optic cable:

- Fusion Splicing:** The most common method, where the bare fibers are aligned and fused using an electric arc. This provides minimal signal loss and high reliability.
- Mechanical Splicing:** Uses a splice sleeve or gel to align fibers without fusion. It is faster but may have slightly higher insertion loss.

After splicing, the joint is protected in a splice tray or closure to prevent damage and maintain performance.
