- 2. Use Proper Splicing Techniques** Fusion splicing is preferred over field-terminated connectors for reliability and low signal loss. Prepare the bare fiber end of the pigtail by stripping, cleaning, and cleaving before splicing. Use high-quality tools such as a fusion splicer, fiber cleaver, and cleaning wipes to ensure precise alignment and minimal attenuation.
- 3. Route and Protect Pigtails** Route pigtails along designated fiber channels or trays to prevent pressure, bending, or damage. Avoid overlapping pigtails excessively; maintain organized loops with gentle bends to respect the fiber's minimum bend radius. Use protective sleeves or ducts where pigtails run alongside electrical cables to prevent mechanical stress.
- 4. Connect to Patch Panels** Plug the connector end of the pigtail into the ODF patch panel or adapter, ensuring proper labeling for easy identification. Maintain consistency...
