Verify the maximum pulling tension and minimum bend radius according to the manufacturer's specifications.

Pulling the Cable Attach the pulling device to the cable's strength member or use a pulling eye mesh for pre-terminated cables. Pull the cable slowly and steadily, avoiding sudden jerks or excessive force. Navigate corners carefully; use sweeps or radius guides to maintain the minimum bend radius and prevent micro-bending. For long runs, consider using a cable winch or vacuum-assisted puller to reduce manual strain and maintain tension control.
