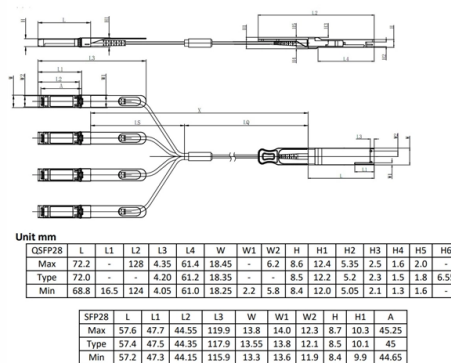


How to sheath ribbon optical cables

Measure and Mark Determine the length of cable to be stripped based on your application (e.g., 8 feet for splicing) (). Mark the cable at the starting point and at the end of the section to be removed. 2. Ring Cut the Jacket Use a cable stripper to make a ring cut at the marked points. For armored cables, make a second ring cut closer to the cable end (). 3. Remove the Outer Jacket Shave or slit the jacket between the ring cuts using a utility knife or hook blade. For armored cables, peel back the steel armor after cutting the steel wires and opening a window in the armor (). Use pliers to remove the remaining jacket and armor carefully. 4. Expose Ripcords and Inner Jacket Pull the ripcords to separate the jacket from the inner core (). Trim water-blocking tape if present. Mark the inner jacket for the length to be removed and slit it to expose the fiber ribbons. 5. Handle Fiber Ribbons Carefully slide out the central buffer tube or inner core to expose the ribbon fibers (). Avoid excessive pulling, bending, or crushing of the fibers (). Tips for Armored Cables Use a cable slitting tool to remove the outer jacket and armor without damaging the inner fibers (). Rotate the tool 180° and repeat the slit if necessary.
