

Piping into the distribution box

Proper piping into a distribution box ensures even effluent flow from the septic tank to the drain field, preventing system overload and failure.

Inlet and Outlet Pipe Connection The inlet pipe connects the septic tank to the distribution box and must be positioned slightly higher than the outlet pipes to maintain proper flow and prevent backflow . Cut the pipe to the correct length and insert it into the inlet opening, ensuring a tight seal. Outlet pipes direct effluent to the leach field and should all be set at the same elevation to achieve balanced distribution .

Sealing and Pipe Types Distribution boxes can accommodate smooth-walled or corrugated pipes, typically 4 inches in diameter . Use twist-and-lock seals or plugs for a secure connection. For increased head installations, apply an asphalt-based sealant to the seal lip before inserting and locking the pipe . This prevents leaks and ensures watertight connections. Plastic, HDPE, or PVC pipes are commonly used due to their corrosion resistance and ease of installation .

Leveling and Flow Adjustment Leveling the distribution box is critical. Use a leveling device or tools like the American Dial-A-Flow™ to ensure the box is horizontal . Proper leveling ensures that effluent is evenly split among all outlet pipes, preventing overloading of any single trench. Flow adjustments can be made by slightly raising or lowering outlet pipes or using flow control devices if available .

Installation Tips Excavate trenches to match the invert elevations of the inlet and outlet pipes . Ensure the box sits on a stable, level pad of compacted soil, cement, or grout . Provide access via risers and a secure lid for inspection and maintenance . Inspect the system after installation to confirm balanced flow and proper sealing . By following these steps, piping into a distribution box will maintain hydraulic balance, protect the drain field, and extend the lifespan of the septic system.
