- Final Checks** Verify that the bend is smooth, cables can be laid without obstruction, and all fasteners are tight. Check for any sharp edges or protrusions that could damage cables during installation.

- Always use two splice plates per tray connection for stability.
- Maintain a consistent bend radius to prevent cable stress.
- Use manufacturer-approved accessories for bends to ensure compliance.
