Application-Specific Cables

1. ADSS (All-Dielectric Self-Supporting)
No metallic components, suitable for installation on power lines

Resistant to high-voltage electromagnetic fields

2. OPGW (Optical Ground Wire)
Replaces standard ground wires on high-voltage towers

Provides lightning protection and high-speed fiber backbone

3. G.657.A2 BIF
Designed for space-constrained FTTH (Fiber to the Home) deployments

Flexible and bend-insensitive

4. MTP/MPO Cables
High-density fiber connectors for data centers

Supports 400G/800G networks

Fiber Count and Configuration

1. Simplex
Single fiber strand, used for unidirectional transmission or BiDi transceivers

2. Duplex
Two fiber strands, one for transmit and one for receive

Standard for full-duplex communication
