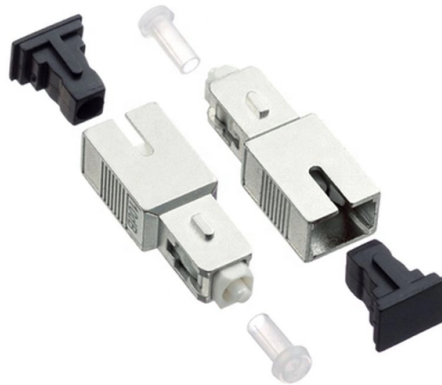

Tightening the screw secures both the wire and the jumper simultaneously, providing a stable mechanical and electrical connection. This type is suitable for high-vibration environments or where a secure, low-resistance connection is critical.
- 4. Insulated Shorting Links** Fully enclosed jumpers designed for safety-critical applications, such as intrinsically safe circuits. The insulation sleeve meets IEC 60947 creepage and clearance requirements, preventing accidental contact and enhancing safety in hazardous areas.

Selection Considerations

Compatibility: Always match the jumper to the specific terminal block series and manufacturer to ensure proper fit and electrical performance.

Current Rating: Verify that the jumper's rated cross-section meets or exceeds the terminal...
